

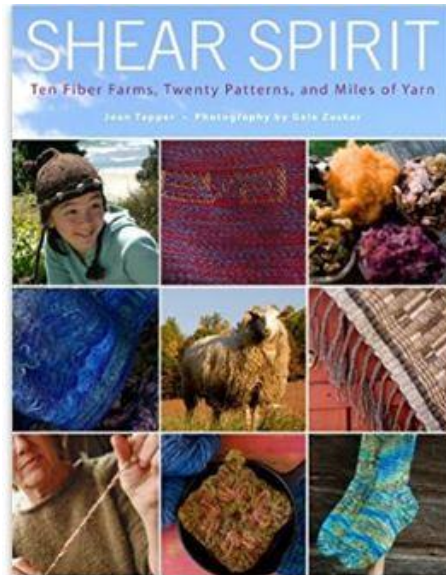


5 Books for Knitters who Love Farm Yarn

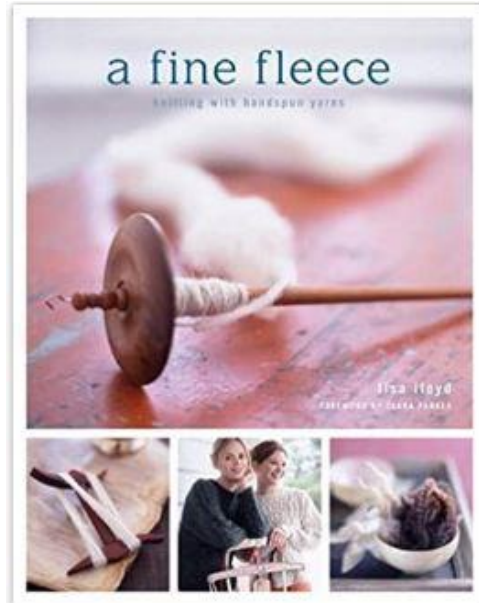
1. [Shear Spirit](#) by Joan Tapper and Gail Zucker. This was my first introduction to farm yarns. I bought this book before I was a fiber farmer. I also bought it before I was a knitter. It is a "coffee table" quality book with great stories about the shepherds, goatherds, animals and farms. It was a book that helped me bring about the dream of Flying Goat Farm.



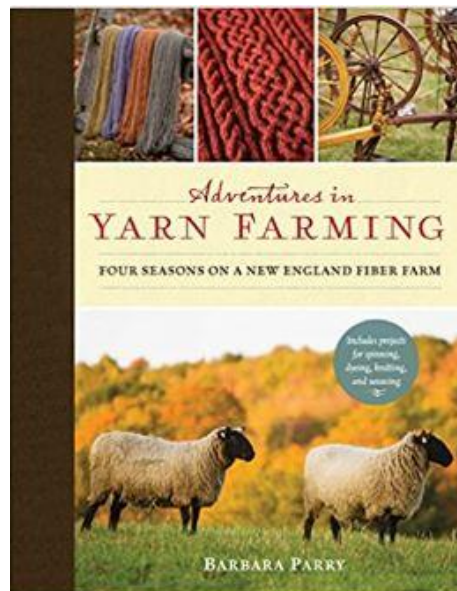
2. [The Natural Knitter](#) by Barbara Albright. Here is another coffee table quality book. It is all about natural fibers from Alpaca to Yak. This book includes plant fibers as well.



3. [A Fine Fleece](#) by Lisa Lloyd This book is all about using handspun in your projects. All the fibers discussed are animal fibers. This book is beautifully photographed and written.



4. [Adventures in Yarn Farming](#) by Barbara Parry This is a fun and realistic look at what it is like to be a yarn farmer. I did buy this book after I had animals and I could really relate to many of her stories of farming throughout the year.
